DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR LIMITED ATTORNEY VOIR DIRE

NOW COMES Defendant, _____ by his attorney, William J. Winters III and in

support of his Motion for Limited Attorney Voir Dire states:

- 1. Defendant is charged with first-degree murder and felony firearm.
- 2. Jury trial is scheduled to commence July 9, 2012.
- 3. MCR 2.412(C)(2) provides that "the court may conduct the examination of the

prospective jurors or permit the lawyers to do so."

2. Age, marital status, children

3 Occupation, supervisor or manager, technical or scientific material review in employment.

- 4. Education, spouse's education
- 5. Spouse's occupation and education.
- 6. Prior jury service. Foreperson?
- 7. Civic, fraternal, professional or community organizations?
- 8. Newspaper, magazine, television, internet reading and viewing habits?
- 9. Military service, law enforcement service or acquaintance in law enforcement.?
- 10. Previous court experience: witness, victim or defendant?
- 11. If told to deliberate now, what verdict?
- 12 (Use your imagination and creativity to craft questions pertaining to your case)
